

Translated letter from Marie Zougalik written  
April 12, 1966, by Mrs Frank Zougalik, Flatoria &  
Mest, Czechoslovakia,  
Dear Uncle (Frank Zougalik Sr.)

Please accept my sincere greeting and my  
assurance that I think of you often wishing  
you a joyful Christmas and a prosperous  
new year, health and good luck.

Finally after all these many years I found  
out your address, your sister Antonia  
Petru wrote that you have three sons  
and three daughters. My husband, Anton  
your nephew told me that he was four  
years old when you sailed for America  
and he remembers that you promised him  
a dollar for a new pair of boots.

We got the address for Mrs Petru from  
Joseph Zougalik, Anton's father because she  
wrote to him, she wrote about her sons  
and daughters, who they all married and  
where they work. She wanted all the news  
from our country, I wrote to her when I  
got her address just before she died and  
told her that my husband Anton died  
Feb 3, 1964. His father isn't living any more  
and his mother has been dead for  
some time

Joseph Zougalik Jr. is living near Zechyni  
and a daughter lives in Hvozdanech, no. 31  
in a house she inherited from her parents.  
She has a cow, pig, chickens, rabbits  
and a small plot of land, has 2 sons  
and one daughter. The daughter is married  
to an Army officer, they have three children.  
One son of Mary Zougalik - Hovorka is a  
bricklayer and her other son is a blacksmith.  
He got married in November they have a  
two story house. The other son Joseph has  
a restaurant in Hvozdanech. My husband  
was always waiting for a letter from you  
but it never came. Mrs Petru sent us  
your picture turning on a faucet and  
letting the water run into a trough.  
We were so happy to see that you can  
not deny looking like one of the Zougalik  
family. Dear Uncle do you write to any  
of the Zougaliks in Europe? One lives  
about an hours journey from her and  
another Peter Zougalik lives near the border  
at Sumperek. I have a little trouble  
with my feet. Mrs Shimek your niece  
wrote me how well you can walk.

How old are you? Sorry you never came to visit your home country. It changed here in the last 60 years. There is a mill here where material for clothing is made, and many people are employed here. There is a sanatorium here and many beautiful houses. Every one has a job, who wants to work does not have to go to America. He has his America right here. Send your sons over to see us, so they can see what a beautiful Country you come from. People who are in America many years come here to visit. This year my friend's 84 year old aunt came. Write and tell me how you have been all these years. I'm sending you our picture. Anton was 61 and I was 59 at the time. The other picture is one of him in the casket. The other is my husband Anton and his brother Joseph with his three daughters. Joseph's wife is paralyzed for the past 8 years. So Uncle please answer when you get this letter. With Best Regards
